Dear Inez.

Hope is convalescing by sea now. you poor things. hope blow & shock not upset you. Hope hear from you hope more details soon. Glad to hear you are well. how is she? Jack had - hold 11 days leave here. will hope see you all day. plans changed, will see day Powell. has written you ten sea letters with mine. I'm posting some every day now. Oh O.K. know you send message back. Much love all Florence.
